At this week's joint meeting with the Rotary Club of Noble Park Keysborough we not only enjoyed each other fellowship, we had the opportunity to listen to Senior Sargent Sarah Carmichael from The Road Police Command.

Sarah together with Marjorie Gerlinger from The Rotary Club of Melbourne have undertaken together to implement a community program dealing with child restraints in cars throughout the Greater Dandenong area.

Sarah was very passionate in her delivery and outlined the challenges faced by the community with language, culture and law obligations. She wants to make a positive difference by ensuring that children seats fit properly, minimising child injuries during car crashes. The current laws on child restraints are confusing and there is a need to educate the community in a positive way.

Sarah has planned a Community Engagement forum on the 20th August followed by two car seat restraints sessions in Springvale on the 31st August and the 1st of September.

She would like our collective assistance with the Rotary Club of Noble Park Keysborough to operate the BBQ for these two days. This would be a fantastic opportunity for us to increase our profile in the local community and to keep achieving our Club's Mission.

Details are on the accompanying flyer. I am sure that Sarah's project will be a success and if it can prevent or minimise injury to our future generation then the cause should be one that we support.

Coins for Kids
